

Afternoon at CatholicCare

Recently we were delighted and honoured to welcome the Apostolic Nuncio to Australia, His Excellency Archbishop Charles Balvo and Bishop Michael McCarthy to our CatholicCare office in Rockhampton.

His Excellency's visit coincided with the ten-year anniversary of Bishop Michael's ordination as Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton.

During a guided tour of our Rockhampton office, led by our CEO, Robert Sims, and General Manager for People and Culture, Anna Morris, Archbishop Charles and Bishop Michael first met with our Social Services team to learn about our programs, including the new Care to You counselling program, which provides in-home counselling services to eligible individuals.

The tour continued with a meeting with Angel from our Court Support team. Angel outlined our Court Support Navigator program which assists domestic violence victim survivors who are navigating the criminal justice system. Archbishop Charles showed particular interest in our team's methods and how service users are supported during such a confronting time.

Next, Archbishop Charles and Bishop Michael met Shayley from our Client Contact team (CCT). They discussed the CCT's role in managing phone calls, emails, webchats, and social media messages. Archbishop Charles enquired about the technology used and how the team handles communication in such a busy environment.

The final tour stop was with Michelle from our Care Management team, who highlighted the various government-subsidised programs and services available to our clients at low or no cost.

Archbishop Charles' visit concluded with afternoon tea and a meet-and-greet with members of our executive team and council.

It was our honour to welcome Archbishop Charles to CatholicCare and to showcase our mission in action by sharing first-hand the impact our programs and services have on the people we serve.

You will need...

- Faux Flowers (Approx 150 medium-large blooms plus some smaller fillers)
- Hot Glue Gun
- Jacket (Preferably collarless)
- Scissors / Wire Cutters (depending on what the flower stems are made from)

Just four simple steps...

- 1. Clip a bunch of the medium/large flowers you've purchased with wire cutters (or scissors if the stems aren't wire), about 1cm from the bloom.
- 2. Start with the back of the coat. Hot glue your largest, favourite blooms sporadically across the back of the coat, saving some for the front. Then go back and continue gluing the additional blooms.
- 3. Flip the coat over and repeat on the front and finally on the sleeves.
- 4. Once all your big blooms are on and the majority of the coat is covered, go back and fill in any gaps with small buds and blooms until you're satisfied with how it looks. Sometimes it's helpful to put the coat on during this step, as it looks different on than it does flat!
